RECOMMENDATION: Award an amount of \$1,000.00, available in the Antelope Valley Air Quality Management District (AVAQMD) General Fund, to the Antelope Valley College Foundation to support the Antelope Valley Air Quality Management District Scholarship Endowment.

SUMMARY: This item awards an amount of \$1,000.00, available in the AVAQMD General Fund, to the Antelope Valley College Foundation in support of the AVAQMD scholarship endowment. The AVAQMD scholarship endowment provides an annual scholarship of \$500.00 to an Antelope Valley College student studying Environmental Science or Engineering.

BACKGROUND: In 2005 the Antelope Valley Air Quality Management District established a scholarship endowment with the Antelope Valley College Foundation to provide an annual scholarship of \$500.00 to an Antelope Valley College student studying Environmental Science or Engineering. Annual investment gains and interest should allow the endowment to provide a \$500.00 scholarship on an annual basis without further investment in the endowment corpus or principle. However, market fluctuations and conservative investment management allowed the endowment corpus to slip below the required fund minimum. Therefore, District staff is requesting Governing Board approval for the allocation of \$1,000.00 to Antelope Valley College Foundation to reestablish the required endowment fund minimum.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: Governing Board approval is needed to approve the allocation from the District's General Fund. Additionally, Governing Board authorization is needed for the Executive Director/APCO to negotiate and execute any agreement required by the fund recipient.
