Item #2 - Grant Funds Project Summary July 2024

AB 2766 (\$4 DMV Fee)

\$655,000 Annually by Monthly Distribution

These fees fund the District's Mobile Source Emission Reductions (MSER) Grant Program. The funds must be used on eligible projects that <u>reduce</u> air pollution from motor vehicles and for related planning, monitoring, enforcement, and technical studies necessary for the implementation of the California Clean Air Act of 1988. **Funding Limits:** No surplus emission reductions or cost-effectiveness limit requirements.

Current Balance: \$806,841.00

AB 923 (\$2 DMV Fee)

\$614,000 Annually by Monthly Distribution

These fees fund the District's Mobile Source Emission Reductions (MSER) Grant Program. The funds must be used on eligible projects that <u>remediate</u> air pollution harms created by motor vehicles. These funds may also be used on Carl Moyer eligible projects; unregulated agriculture vehicles and equipment; school bus projects; light-duty vehicle retirement program; and alternative fuel and electric infrastructure projects.

Funding Limits: Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to CARB's cost-effectiveness limit.

Current Balance: \$1,772,321.00

Carl Moyer Program (CMP)

\$1,389,487.00 FY 23/24 Allocation Pending

Carl Moyer Program (CMP) funds are used toward projects eligible under the Carl Moyer Program Guidelines. Program goals are to gain early or extra emission reductions by retrofitting, repowering, or replacing older more polluting engines with newer, cleaner engines including zero and near zero emission technologies. CMP funding categories include on-road heavy-duty vehicles, off-road equipment, light-duty passenger vehicles, lawn mower replacement and alternative fuel infrastructure projects.

Funding Limits: Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to CARB's cost-effectiveness limit.

Current Balance: \$1,920,364.00

AB 134 Community Air Protection Program (CAPP) Incentives

\$967,560 FY 23/24

Community Air Protection Program (CAPP) funds are used toward eligible projects under the CAPP and CMP Guidelines. Eligible projects must also be needed and supported within the community. These funds are focused on replacing older polluting engines, operating in disadvantaged and low-income communities, with newer, cleaner engines with a priority for zero-emissions. Funding categories include on-road heavy-duty vehicles, off-road equipment, light duty passenger vehicles, lawn mower replacement and alternative fuel infrastructure projects.

Funding Limits: Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to CARB's cost-effectiveness limit.

RECOMMENDATION: 1) Award an amount not to exceed \$65,761 in Mobile Source Emission Reductions Program (AB 2766) funds to Antelope Valley Fair Association (AV Fair) for a truck replacement project; 2) Authorize the Executive Director/APCO the option to change the funding source if warranted or if other applicable sources become available; 3) Authorize the Executive Director/APCO and staff to negotiate target time frames and technical project details and execute agreements, approved as to legal form by the Office of District Counsel; and 4) Find that the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) does not apply to this item.

SUMMARY: This item awards funding to AV Fair for the replacement of an older gasoline truck with a newer, cleaner gasoline engine technology. The grant is awarded of in Mobile Source Emission Reductions (AB 2766) funds for the maximum eligible amount of eighty (80) percent of the project costs estimated at \$82,203.

BACKGROUND: AV Fair applied for grant assistance for the replacement of an older gasoline truck with a new truck focused on zero emissions technology. AV Fair consulted with the District and dealerships for zero-emission replacement options; however, a zero-emission replacement could not be identified in equivalent size, performance and reliability needed to carry out the various functions within the AV Fair grounds. Staff has reviewed the proposed project and finds that it meets replacement eligibility for funding in accordance with the Mobile Source Emission Reductions Program funds. The District proposes to support the replacement project at the standard rate of eighty (80) percent of the project costs. AB 2766 funds may be used to support programs that reduce emissions from motor vehicles and related planning.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: Governing Board approval is needed for the use of District funds. Additionally, Governing Board authorization is needed for the Executive Director/APCO and staff to negotiate and execute an agreement with the grant recipient.

SUMMARY: This item awards funding to LA County Sanitation Districts (LACSD) towards development of a Dual-Port DC (Level III) electric vehicle charging station located at the LACSD Palmdale Facility. The grant is awarded of Carl Moyer Program funds for the maximum eligible amount of fifty (50) percent of the project costs estimated at \$225,000.

BACKGROUND: LA County Sanitation Districts applied for grant assistance for the development of an Electric Vehicle Charging Station at their LACSD Palmdale Facility. The EV charging station will support fleet vehicles inside the treatment plant and will not be publicly accessible. Site engineers have identified enough power on the existing plant switchboard to support the proposed charging stations. Staff has reviewed the proposed project and finds that it meets eligibility for funding in accordance with the Carl Moyer Program Guidelines for fifty (50) percent of the project costs. This project supports the District and State goals on the adoption of electric technology to move California closer to the 2025 goal of 1.5 million zero-emission vehicles on the road.
