Item #4 – Grant Funds Project Summary November 2023

AB 2766 (\$4 DMV Fee)

\$655,000 Annually by Monthly Distribution

These fees fund the District's Mobile Source Emission Reductions (MSER) Grant Program. The funds must be used "to <u>reduce</u> air pollution from motor vehicles and for related planning, monitoring, enforcement, and technical studies necessary for the implementation of the California Clean Air Act of 1988". **Funding Limits:** No surplus emission reductions or cost-effectiveness limit requirements.

Current Balance: \$324,356.00

AB 923 (\$2 DMV Fee)

\$614,000 Annually by Monthly Distribution

These fees fund the District's Mobile Source Emission Reductions (MSER) Grant Program. The funds must be used to <u>remediate</u> air pollution harms created by motor vehicles.

Funding Limits: Carl Moyer eligible projects; unregulated agriculture vehicles and equipment; school bus projects; light-duty vehicle retirement program; and alternative fuel and electric infrastructure projects. Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to cost-effectiveness limit.

Current Balance: \$711,739.00

Carl Moyer Program

\$1,169,166.00 FY 23/24 Allocation

Carl Moyer Program (CMP) funds provide incentives to gain early or extra emission reductions by retrofitting, repowering, or replacing older more polluting engines with newer, cleaner engines including zero and near zero emission technologies. CMP funding categories include on-road heavy-duty vehicles, off-road equipment, locomotives, marine vessels, light-duty passenger vehicles, lawn mower replacement and alternative fuel infrastructure projects. Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to cost-effectiveness limit.

Current Balance: \$1,876,586.00

AB 134 Community Air Protection (CAP) Projects

\$967,560 FY 23/24

The purpose of AB 134 funds is to implement projects under the Carl Moyer Program specifically for projects that meet the goals of AB 617. These funds are focused on replacing older polluting engines operating in disadvantaged and low-income communities with newer, cleaner engines prioritizing zero-emission projects. CMP funding categories include on-road heavy-duty vehicles, off-road equipment, locomotives, marine vessels, light-duty passenger vehicles, lawn mower replacement and alternative fuel infrastructure projects. Surplus emission reductions required. Subject to cost-effectiveness limit.

SUMMARY: This action formally accepts Community Air Protection Funding (CAP) allocated and awarded to the District for eligible projects and program administration for Year 7 (Fiscal Year 23-24). This action also accepts the terms and conditions for the funds as appropriated, and authorizes staff to negotiate and execute project agreements consistent with the terms and conditions.

BACKGROUND: On September 16, 2017, the Governor approved AB 134 to amend the Budget Act of 2017. The amendment added appropriations to the Budget Act of 2017, taking effect immediately as a Budget Bill. Under Schedule 3 of this Bill, \$250 million was to be distributed by CARB to air districts for implementation of projects pursuant to the Carl Moyer Program. The purpose of the funds are to support Greenhouse Gas reductions and early actions that reduce emissions and improve public health in communities with high burdens of cumulative pollutant exposure, consistent with the goals of Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (Chapter 254, Statutes of 2017). Fiscal Year 22-23. CAP incentives will be used to reduce emissions in communities most heavily burdened by air pollution, in support of AB 617. The Air District will select projects eligible under the proposed 2019 Community Air Protection Incentives Guidelines and the Carl Moyer Program 2017 Guidelines with a focus on zero-emissions projects as feasible in low-income and disadvantaged communities.

REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION: CARB requires the Governing Board formally approve District acceptance of the funds and participation in the program.

SUMMARY: This item awards funding to EV Charging Solutions to replace the City of Palmdale's existing, inoperable EV charging equipment. The EV charging equipment consist of two (2) Level II single-port chargers and one (1) Level III dual-port charger located at City Hall in their publicly accessible parking area.

BACKGROUND: Over the years the City of Palmdale has deployed a number of EV charging stations throughout the City in effort to encourage the adoption of electric vehicles. The City of Palmdale informed the District that a number of earlier model charging stations are inoperable, obsolete, and/or are no longer receiving support from the manufacturer including parts. To continue to support the needs of EV consumers and the community, the City has partnered with EV Charging Solutions to replace the existing equipment to bring the EV charging stations back into operation. Staff has evaluated the project for the use of Mobile Source Emission Reductions Program (AB 923) funds and finds the proposed project eligible for 60% of the costs as proposed. This project supports the District and State goals of providing EV consumers reliable options for charging as California moves closer to the 2025 goal of putting 1.5 million zero-emission vehicles on the road.

BACKGROUND: AVAQMD received an application from Peter Tejada for grant funding to replace an older diesel farm tractor. Applicant is not subject to any diesel offroad equipment regulation and proposes voluntary participation in the off-road equipment replacement program to reduce emissions by early retirement of an older, higher polluting diesel tractor and replacing it with new, cleaner diesel technology that meets the current emission standards. Staff has evaluated the project for eligibility pursuant to the guidelines and finds the proposed project eligible for 80% percent toward the replacement equipment. Retirement of the older polluting tractor produces an estimated 0.40 ton/yr. early emission reductions. Early fleet turnover provides emission reductions that help the Valley towards attainment of the national ambient air quality standards.

BACKGROUND: AVAQMD received an application from Delores Yarnall for grant funding to replace an older diesel ranch tractor. Applicant is not subject to any diesel offroad equipment regulation and proposes voluntary participation in the off-road equipment replacement program to reduce emissions by early retirement of an older, higher polluting diesel tractor and replacing it with new, cleaner diesel technology that meets the current emission standards. Staff has evaluated the project for eligibility pursuant to the guidelines and finds the proposed project eligible for 80% percent toward the replacement equipment. Retirement of the older polluting tractor produces an estimated 1.59 ton/yr. early emission reductions. Early fleet turnover provides emission reductions that help the Valley towards attainment of the national ambient air quality standards.

SUMMARY: This item awards an amount not to exceed \$70,584 of Mobile Source Emission Reductions Program (AB 2766) funds. AV Fair proposes to permanently retire four (4) older in-use conventional fuel equipment with clean, zero emissions technologies.

BACKGROUND: AVAQMD received an application from AV Fair for grant assistance to purchase four (4) zero emissions UTV utility carts. AV Fair will voluntarily retire four (4) in-use conventional fuel equipment within their fleet to reduce emissions in exchange for grant funding toward the purchase of four (4) zero emission UTV utility carts. Pursuant to the Mobile Source Emission Reductions Program guidelines, AB 2766 funds may be used towards projects that reduce air pollution from motor vehicles. Staff has evaluated the proposed project and finds the project beneficial to the District's efforts to reduce local emissions. Staff proposes to support the proposed project with eighty-percent (80%) of the project costs. Applicant proposes voluntary participation in the District's mobile source emission reductions program to reduce emissions by permanently retiring older polluting equipment with zero emissions. The removal and destruction of older polluting equipment provides emission reductions that help the Valley towards attainment of the national ambient air quality standards.
